## Core Education

Area of Inquiry requirements (**beginning F20**): Students must take courses in at least 2 subject codes in each Area of Inquiry. A maximum of 3 courses in any one subject code toward the total credits across all Areas of Inquiry. **Pre-F20** Group requirements: 15-16 credit hours in each of the areas. At least 2 (but no more than 3) courses from any one subject (prefix); at least one course with a second prefix.
