LTS Application Materials

The following are materials that we ask you to submit with your application. Please have these prepared when applying.

- Unofficial transcripts from any and all post-secondary institutions attended. Note: transcripts in a language other than English should be translated, but this unofficial translation does not need to be certified.
 - Example: You are currently attending the UO but have transfer credits from your hometown college. You will need to submit unofficial transcripts from your hometown college AND the UO.
 - If you are admitted, an official transcript will be required, and a certified translation if in a language other than English.
- Statement of Purpose: The Statement of Purpose should be between 3 and 5 pages in essay format. Artificial Intelligence tools should not be used to compose this text; it should be an example of your own writing abilities and your own voice. Please include specific information about:
 - What prior educational and/or professional experiences have led you to apply to the LTS MA program
 - How these experiences have prepared you for academic success in the LTS
 MA program
 - What potential goals you have after the program
 - o What the LTS program offers that will help prepare you for these goals
 - Who your imagined future learners might be, and what approaches to language learning might be most effective for them
- IF English is not your primary language, you will need to report your English language
 TOEFL or IELTS test scores in the application to meet the Division of Graduate
 Studies' English Language Proficiency Requirement. Proof of these scores will be
 required if you are admitted.
- Recommendations: In the application you will be asked to provide the names and email addresses for 3 individuals who are willing to submit a letter of recommendation for you. These letters should be from faculty or supervisors who can speak to your academic or professional and personal readiness for graduate study.
