Production Credits Requirements for Undergraduate Theatre Majors

Majors are required to complete 3 production assignments. Each position is worth 1-3 credits. The number of credits and the specific course number – (TA 321, 322, 323, 324) - is determined by the assignment you are given. A list of the production assignments is posted in the Green Room. Please follow the instructions posted with the lists.

Ideally, you should work in three different areas. But the specific requirement is **3 different assignments** and a minimum total of 3 credits in any combination of TA 321, 322, 323 and 324.

You MUST register for your Production Credit(s) IN DUCKWeb the term you are doing the work. Failure to do so will require you to file a petition with the Registrar's Office to add the credits after the add/drop deadline. Such a petition may be denied.

If you are assigned a job after the add deadline or if financial hardship prevents you from registering for the extra credit, you can delay your registration by **ONE term**, registering the term directly following the completion of your production assignment.
